<b>Job Purpose</b>
To deliver high quality, effective and safe therapeutic provision to self-identified female and gender diverse survivors of sexual violence.
To be responsible for provision of individual therapeutic support sessions to service users.
To ensure ethical practice according to BACP guidelines and Survivors' Network policies and procedures.
Completing notes and administrative duties on a weekly basis as required.
To actively engage in collection of client data for the monitoring systems, CORE.

<b>Duties and Responsibilities</b>
To provide trauma-appropriate individual therapeutic support to survivors.
To attend fortnightly clinical group supervision.
To attend monthly service meetings.
To complete and store confidential notes according to Survivors' Network policies.
To complete administrative duties on a weekly basis and as required.



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To actively engage, on a weekly basis, in collection of client data for the monitoring systems, namely CORE and DPMS.

To conduct initial assessment of service users.

To communicate, when necessary, with the Adult Therapeutic Services Manager.

To maintain up to date knowledge on issues relevant to the provision of therapeutic services and the violence against women and girls field.

To develop and maintain up to date knowledge on the provision of 'pre-trial therapy'.

To be aware of and act in accordance with Survivors' Network policies and procedures, with particular reference to safeguarding policies.

To be aware of the relevance of the Empowerment Model (the Rape Crisis model of effective support for survivors) in supporting survivors.

To be committed to personal and professional development and undertake relevant training and CPD.

To support, promote and work in accordance with Survivors' Network's aims and objectives.
