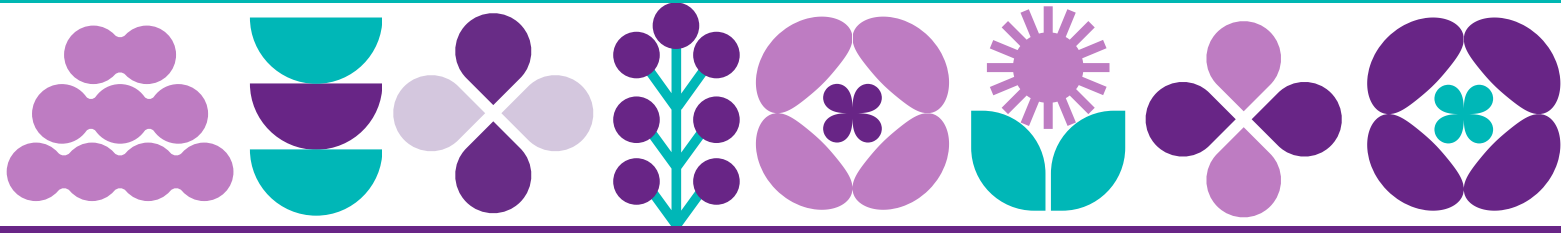
## Vision

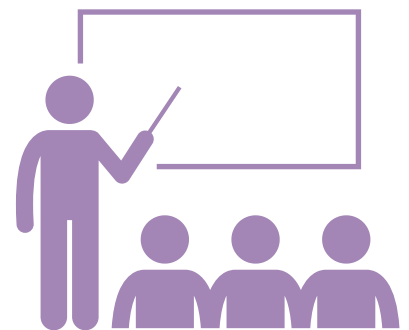
